

The Governor issued the following requisition to the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension and delivery up of John Russell, a fugitive from the justice of this State.

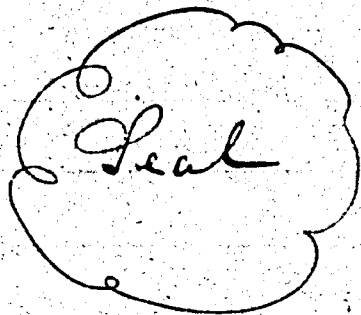
State of Maryland, to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland.

To his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that John Russell late of Allegany County stands charged on the oath of John Everett with horse stealing and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said John Russell be apprehended and delivered to Jacob Cook Agent of the State of Maryland who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to Law.



In witness whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this thirty first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.
