

March 12th 1849

The Governor appointed and commissioned Frederick Lucas director of the Maryland Penitentiary vice Thomas E. Ambler Commission expired; and also appointed and commissioned David Helan director of the Maryland Penitentiary vice George W. Cox Commission expired.

March 13th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Jas. M. Allston justice of the peace for Saint Marys County vice George W. Blackstone declined to qualify.

March 16th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John A. Gearley a justice of the peace for Kent County vice Thomas P. Appington deceased.

March 19th 1849

The Governor this day received and approved the official bond of Lewis C. Myers appointed a Notary Public to reside at Frederick vice John Thomas resigned and thereupon issued a Commission to the said Myers which was sent to the Clerk of Frederick County Court as Notary Public bearing date the 17th instant.

March 20th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William L. G. Bell Colonel 23rd Regiment M. M. vice William H. Curtis decd.

March 21st 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of twenty one of the Grand jury who presented him, of the panel of jurors who tried him and of many respectable citizens of Frederick County pardoned Lloyd Harding convicted on indictment in Frederick County Court at February Term 1849 of stealing a pair of shoes (see record of pardons)

March 22nd 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Augustus S. Grove a justice of the peace for Worcester County vice Levin Hitch removed from the County.

March 24th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Jackson Dorney associate justice of District Court No. 1 of Harford County vice Albert Dorney resigned.

March 27th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Chustran Shepherd one of the Justices of Washington County vice David B. Price who refused to accept Commission.
