

March 28th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the panel of jurors who tried her and many respectable citizens of Howard District, pardoned Rachel Hawkins convicted in said District Court at March term 1849 of stealing two Bank notes upon condition that she be bound out to service until she arrives at the age of eighteen.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Bruce L. Goldborough one of the judges of Dorchester County Court and others remitted the fines of fifty dollars each imposed by Dorchester County Court upon Levin M. Quay for selling liquor without a license convicted in two cases at the October term 1848 of said Court.

March 29. 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned M. O. Dartson Captain of the Echo Light Artillery Company attached to 50th Regiment M. M. and also appointed and commissioned Joseph Knode 1st Lieutenant of same Company.

April 5th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Francis Henry Adjutant 10th Regiment of Cavalry M. M. commanded by Col. J. W. Potter. also appointed and commissioned John F. Bonn Quarter Master of same Regiment, and also appointed and commissioned William A. Dorn's Paymaster of same Regiment.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Edmund Key one of the judges of Prince George's County Court, of Thomas L. Bowie the Deputy Attorney General in and for that County and of many respectable citizens of that County granted a Nolle Prosequi to William Anderson of Edward indicted for an attempt with intent to kill and murder one Sarah Canick (ne nee of Harmons).

April 6th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John S. Lambert Justice of the Peace of Prince George's County Court vice John Manning resigned.

April 9th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned William C. Sturgis Justice of the Peace of Worcester County vice John Anderson resigned.

April 16th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many of the Grand Jury who presented him and of Thomas L. Bowie Deputy Attorney General and of many others of the most respectable citizens of Prince George's County, granted a Nolle Prosequi to Richard W. Darnall presented for the crime of cutting and disfiguring one of the fingers on the right hand of William Bigley with intent to maim and disfigure the said William Bigley.
