

April 16th 1849

The Governor appointed and commissioned Grace T. Blanchamp Lt. Col. 23rd Regiment M. M. vice Polk promoted.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Lyles justice of the peace for Anne Arundel County vice Col. John Wood deceased.

April 17th 1849

The Governor this day remitted the fine of twenty five dollars imposed by Talbot County Court at the November term 1847 on George W. Scott for assault and battery on Charles Underwood; and also remitted the fine of twenty five dollars imposed by same Court at same term on Edward O. Martin for menacing and threatening the officers when preserving the peace at the time the assault and battery on Charles Underwood was committed by George W. Scott.

April 23rd 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Henry D. Station justice of the peace for Prince George's County vice George H. Hunter declined to qualify.

The Governor appointed and commissioned H. Mattingly of John justice of the peace of Saint Mary's County vice George Hackett declined to qualify.

The Governor appointed and commissioned James M. Cathell justice of the peace for Worcester County vice James Gentry resigned.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Brain and others remitted the forfeited recognizance of James G. Williams and Thomas A. Burgess which had been entered into by them for the appearance of the said Williams before the judges of Charles County Court at the August term 1843.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Brain and others also remitted the forfeited recognizance of Thomas Day and John H. James which had been entered into by them for the appearance of the said day before the judges of Charles County Court at the March term 1846.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Michael C. Adelsberger associate justice of the 5th election District Court for Frederick County vice W. Mooney declined to qualify; and also James Krauff sen^r associate justice of same Court vice Francis C. Horner resigned and appointed and commissioned David Agnew a justice of the peace for Frederick County vice Adelsberger made associate justice of the 5th election District Court of said County.

April 24th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Samuel Chesnut Captain "National Blues" attached to 53rd Regiment M. V. Infantry vice Pickel re-
