

May 5th 1849
The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Lewis Cullen
Major 23rd Regiment (M.M. vice Blanchamp promoted).

May 8th 1849
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable
citizens of Somerset County granted a Nolle Prosequi to Theodore Carter charged
by the Grand Jury of said County with the crime of offering to bribe one William P.
Hewitt at the last November election (see record of Parsons)

The Governor appointed and commissioned Joseph Redue
Clerk of Kent County Court vice Dr. N. Gordon deceased.

May 9th 1849
The Governor having on the 4th instant received the record of the
conviction and sentence of Conrad Wenter alias Conrad Bender for the murder
of Elizabeth Cooper in Baltimore County Court, issued this day the following
Death Warrant.

State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Baltimore County Greeting:
Whereas Conrad Wenter alias Conrad Bender late of Baltimore
County was convicted of the felony and murder of one Elizabeth Cooper late of
said Baltimore County and the said Court sentenced him to be hung by the
neck until he be dead.

Now therefore there are to will and require as a law to
charge and command you that at or before the hour of one O'clock P.M. on
Friday the twentieth day of July next you take the said Conrad Wenter alias
Conrad Bender from your prison and him safely convey to the Gallows in the County
aforesaid the place of the execution of Malefactors and there the said Conrad
Wenter alias Conrad Bender hang by the neck until he be dead. For all which
this shall be your sufficient power and authority.

of Maryland this Ninth day of May in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred and forty nine and the Independence
of the United States the seventy third

Associate Justice of the 12th election District Court of Baltimore
County vice James Tucker declined to qualify.

May 12th 1849
The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judge Eccleston and
others remitted the forfeited recognizance of Henry Frederick for his appearance before
Baltimore County Court and also remitted the fine of ten dollars imposed on said Henry Frederick
at Oct. Term 1846 of said Court for selling liquor without a license.
