

May 15th 1849

The Governor this day remitted the interest due by Wm A Lupton to the state on the balance of \$337.85 due for the year 1843 and on the balance of \$1964.20 due for the year 1844 as collector of state taxes in the third collection district of Prince Georges County for those years.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Robert R. Chandler Chief district justice of the sixth election district Court of Harford County vice Wm L. Nichols who declined to qualify.

The Governor remitted the interest due by George M. Stis to the State, collector of state taxes in the 9th & 12th districts of Baltimore County for the year 1845.

May 17th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Anne Arundel County remitted the fines of \$20. each imposed by Anne Arundel County Court upon Stephen Mayson and James E. White Jr. at the April term 1849 for an assault and battery upon one John Shucks.

The Governor appointed and commissioned David Fordney justice of the peace for Washington County vice Thomas Clingan removed from the State.

May 22nd 1849

The Governor this day upon the petition of James B. King coll^r of the State taxes for the years 1844 and 1848 in the 3rd Collection District for Calvert County remitted the interest on the sums respectively due by him for those years which accrued before the 1st of January 1849 because he had not demanded or received interest from the tax payers; and upon his assurance that he would not demand or receive interest due prior to that day.

The Governor issued the following requisition to the Governor of New York for the apprehension and delivery of James Sullivan a fugitive from the justice of the State of Maryland.

State of Maryland to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland

To His Excellency the Governor of New York

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that James Sullivan late of Kent County stands charged with the crime of assault and battery upon Thomas Hyer by the Grand Jury of said County and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of New York.

I do therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said James Sullivan be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Gifford who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this twenty second day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine
