May 31st 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Moses Dillon Captain of Ruggole Inf: 1st to Rec: 10th M. M. former Commission vacated by failing to report as by res. N. 84 of 1847 and also appointed & commissioned Moses Cox 1st Lt of same Company for same reason; and also appointed and commissioned B. F. Cronise 2nd Lt of same Company for same reason.

The Governor upon the recommendation of the Deputy of the Attorney General in and for Frederick County and Madison Nelson and others of the most respectable citizens of that County granted a Nolle Prosequi to Thomas Butler a slave for life of Benjamin Todd charged with an assault with intent to kill one Abraham Smith.

June 5th 1849

The Governor this day received the following communication from the Honorable W. G. D. Watlington one of the Associate Judges of Baltimore city Court

"Baltimore June 4th 1849
To His Excellency Philip Francis Thomas
Governor of Maryland

Sir: As an Associate Judge of Baltimore city Court, I hereby resign that office henceforth & forever

The Governor remitted the fine of \$20. each imposed upon William Cook, Bradford Daring & William Samson by Baltimore city Court at January term 1849 for noting on condition of payment of costs and on further condition that they give such security for their good behaviour as may be required by Baltimore city Court.

June 9th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John Spencer Adjutant 8th Regimental Cavalry District M. M.

The Governor remitted the fine of twenty dollars imposed on Benjamin D. Kiss by Baltimore city Court at January term 1849 for noting on condition of payment of costs and on further condition that he give security such as said court may require, for his good behaviour for twelve months.

June 12th 1849

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens remitted the fine of thirty dollars imposed upon Wesley Grandell by Anne Arundel County Court at April term 1849 for shooting with shot negro George slave of Alexander Franklin
