

July 23rd 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Kennedy R. Owen Colonel 26th Regiment M.M. former commission vacated, having failed to report as required by resolution No 84 of December Session 1847;

also appointed and commissioned William Hayward Lt. Colonel of same Regiment former commission vacated for same reason;

also appointed and commissioned Henry C. Bateman Colonel of the 4th Regiment M.M. former commission vacated for same reason;

also appointed and commissioned Richard Thomas Lt. Colonel of same Regiment former commission vacated for same reason;

and also appointed and commissioned Hughlett C. Mackey Major of same Regiment.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Brain remitted the recognizance entered into by William Cox, G. B. Brown and John P. Lawren, in the sum of four hundred dollars, for the appearance of the said William Cox before Charles County Court and for his good behavior to Margaret Wheeler, which had been forfeited, upon condition of payment of costs.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Harbitt and many citizens of the city of Baltimore remitted the fine of twenty dollars imposed by Baltimore City Court on William Marshall at the January term 1849 for rioting upon condition of payment of costs and on further condition that he give such security for his good behavior as may be required by said Court.

The Governor this day issued the following requisition directed to the Governor of Pennsylvania:

State of Maryland to wit:

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland

To His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania:

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that a certain Samuel H. Frazier otherwise called Dr. Samuel H. Frazier did on or about the fifteenth day of July instants feloniously steal take and carry away a small gold watch the property of one John Pickel against the consent of the said John Pickel and against the peace government and dignity of the State of Maryland and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said Samuel H. Frazier otherwise called Dr. Samuel H. Frazier be apprehended and delivered to William Duncan who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this twenty fourth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine
