The Governor issued the following request to the Governor of Pennsylvania
State of Maryland to wit: Philip Thomas Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland
In His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this state that a certain John Ryan otherwise called John Obrien did on or about the twenty first day of July last feloniously steal take and carry away one bay horse of the value of one hundred dollars, one saddle of the value of five dollars and one bridle of the value of one dollar the goods and property of one John Obrien; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state and has taken refuge within the state of Pennsylvania.

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said John Ryan otherwise called John Obrien be apprehended and delivered to John Zell a citizen of the State of Maryland who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
