

August 15th 1849

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to negro Ann Slave of Wm Goldborough of Talbot County charged with the crime of running away from her master, on condition that she be sold beyond the limits of the State as a slave for life.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William Tolson an associate justice of District Court No. 6 in Prince George's County vice Geo. S. Tolson resigned.

August 20th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Howard District remitted the fine of fifty dollars imposed upon Jonathan Brown by Howard District Court at March term 1849 for keeping a disorderly house.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Henry B. S. Key of Saint Mary's County a Commissioner on the part of the State of Maryland to act in conjunction with a Commissioner appointed or to be appointed on the part of each of the States of Pennsylvania and Delaware for the ascertainment of the original site of the boundary stone of the North eastern Corner of this State where it joins the said States of Pennsylvania and Delaware, and for re-marking the same with a stone or other proper monument.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William B. Fugerson Aid de Camp to James L. Maguire Esquire Brigadier General 2nd Light Brigade 2nd Light division M. V.; also appointed and commissioned Robert Leslie junior Major and Inspector 2nd Light Brigade 2nd Light division M. V. & also appointed and commissioned James P. Delacour Captain, Robert E. Arken 1st Lieutenant and William Landstreet 2nd Lieutenant 56th Regiment attached to 14th Brigade 3rd Division M. V.

August 21st 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John H. Sanborn justice of the peace for Prince George's County vice he having heretofore resigned but will now serve.

The Governor issued the following requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania.

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland

To His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that William Dorsey a free negro stands charged with the crime of stealing a horse the property of one Samuel L. Stonestreet and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request (that)
