August 24th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John A. Dyer a justice of the peace for Charles County vice Alexander Green declined to qualify.

August 25th 1849

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Negro Daniel Slave of Charlotte Leeds Edmundson of Talbot County charged with the crime of running away from his mistress.

August 27th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Henry Thomas justice of the peace for Talbot County vice James E. Carbutt deceased.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Oliver Harrison Captain, Daniel M. Harrison 1st Lieutenant and O. J. Sparks 2nd Lieutenant of St. Michael Guards attached to 26th Regt. M. M.

The Governor upon the recommendation of a great many of the most respectable citizens of the city of Baltimore pardoned John A. McKee and George Grey convicts of the crime of arson at the January Term 1848 of Baltimore city Court sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary.

August 30th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Charles Carroll Colonel of the 32nd Regiment M. M. former commission vacated, having failed to report under Regulation No 84 of December Session 1847; also appointed and commissioned Edward L. Peteler Major of the 10th Regiment M. M. former commission vacated for same reason; also appointed and commissioned James E. Cassidy Captain, Charles R. Holland 1st Lieutenant, Thomas B. Davis 2nd Lt and Walker R. Johns 3rd Lt of Patapsco Riflemen attached to 32nd Regiment M. M.

The Governor upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Caroline County remitted the fine of twenty five dollars imposed on Joshua Blake for not at the March Term 1848 of said County Court.

September 1st 1849

The Governor this day upon the receipt of the requisition of the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension and delivery of Henry Stue charged with the crime of horse stealing committed in the County of Huntingdon in said State issued his warrant therefor.
