September 4th 1849

The Governor this day remitted the interest due by William Gray collector of State taxes in Calvert County on the balances for the years 1844 & 1848 due by him

September 5th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Samuel H. Inver Lt. Colonel 1st Rifle Regiment attached to 2nd Light Brigade M. C. vice Peters promoted; and also appointed & commissioned Capt. A. McAllister Major of same Regiment vice Inver promoted

September 6th 1849

The Governor this day appointed & commissioned Samuel G. Brown Captain "Mounted Carbuncles" 1st Light Cavalry Regiment attached to 1st Light Brigade M. C. vice Murdoch deceased.

September 7th 1849

The Governor this day appointed & commissioned Frederick L. Grammer justice of the peace of the city of Baltimore for the first district comprising the 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th wards vice Robert Atkew deceased.

September 8th 1849

The Governor this day appointed & commissioned George S. Tolson justice of the Court of Prince Georges County vice Dr. Wm. T. Houston resigned.

September 14th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the directors of the Penitentiary and its officers and also upon the recommendation of a great many of the most respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned Samuel Jones convicted at the October term 1844 of Baltimore city Court of murder in the second degree and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 2nd August 1858.

September 17th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Jacob Shover Major 15th Regiment M. M. vice Brunswick. Commission vacated, having failed to report as required by resolution of 24th Decr. Session 1847; and also appointed and commissioned George Richards 1st Lieutenant, David W. Honck 1st Lieutenant, Jesse Pugh 2nd Lieutenant, Hezekiah Jordan 3rd Lieutenant and Joseph Honck Ensign of Carroll Infantry attached to 15th Reg. M. M.

Sept^r 19th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Hezekiah M. Vais justice of the peace of Montgomery County vice John Lowe deceased
