

September 19th 1849

The Governor appointed and commissioned Henry Reaver Commissioner to take the acknowledgements of deeds &c. to reside at George Town in the District of Columbia vice John P. Still deceased

September 20th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Dr. J. Miles Surgeon Major of the 26th Regiment M. M.

The Governor appointed and commissioned William S. Graff Commissioner to take the acknowledgements of deeds &c. to reside at St. Pauls in the Territory of Minnesota

The Governor appointed and commissioned Albert W. Smith Commissioner to take the acknowledgements of deeds &c. to reside at Wilmington in the State of Delaware.

The Governor released the interest on the balance due by George H. Hill Collector of State taxes in Baltimore County for the year 1846 after requiring the said George H. Hill to pay thereon the Commission paid by the State to J. N. Caste Esquire for collection by suit. This done because his Sureties were compelled to pay it.

September 22nd 1849

The Governor this day upon the receipt of the requisition of the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension of Lewis Guse and James Henry Guse charged by indictment of the crime of obtaining money and goods under false pretences issued his warrant directed to the Sheriff of Baltimore City commanding him to arrest and deliver them to Lt. J. D. Rodarmel the agent of that State appointed for the purpose if they be found in his jurisdiction.

The Governor upon the recommendation of the directors of the Penitentiary and its officers and of a great many of the most respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned William Freburger convicted at the October Term 1844 of Baltimore City Court of murder in the second degree and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 2nd day of August eighteen hundred and fifty eight.

September 24th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the directors of the Penitentiary and its officers and of a great many of the most respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned Charles Brown convicted at the October Term 1844 of Baltimore City Court of murder in the second degree and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 2nd day of August eighteen hundred and fifty eight.

September 26th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Hale McAllister Commissioner to take the acknowledgements of deeds &c. to reside in the Territory of California
