

Oct 5th 1849

The Governor this day upon receipt of the requisition of the Governor of Pennsylvania issued his warrant directed to the Sheriff of Washington County commanding him to arrest George Reynolds a fugitive from the justice of that State and deliver him to John M. Fisher agent appointed to receive and convey him to the State of Pennsylvania there he shall wait according to law.

Oct 6th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John Livingston Commissioner to take the acknowledgements of deeds &c. to reside in the city of New York

Oct 10th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judge Ashteth and of many other respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned James Pott and also George W. Brown convicted of a conspiracy to defraud George W. Grant of the sum of fifty dollars and sentenced to be imprisoned six months and fined fifty dollars

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Marshall remitted the recognizance entered into by Philip Kuhn, Jacob Youngst, and Jacob Woffel for the appearance of Philip Kuhn senr. before Frederick County Court at November Term 1848 in the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars which had been forfeited.

Oct 13th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Richard Seymour 1st Lieutenant of Columbia Riflemen 1st Regiment of Riflemen M. C.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Ashteth and the prosecuting witnesses pardoned Robert L. E. Anderson convicted in Baltimore City Court at September Term 1849 of felony upon indictment that he feloniously leave the State never to return into it again

Oct 15th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of J. Gordon M. Blair and a great many of the most respectable citizens of the city of Annapolis granted a Nolle Prosequi to William Alexander charged with an assault upon the said J. Gordon M. Blair with a pistol loaded with shot, committed in the County of Anne Arundel on or about the seventeenth day of September last.

The Governor appointed and commissioned Samuel H. Loner Auctioneer in the city of Baltimore vice N. E. Hopkins who failed to apply for his commission as required by law

Oct 18th 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the jury by whom he was tried and convicted and by many of the respectable citizens
