Now therefore I Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland do hereby certify that by the returns of the Judges of said Election in the several Counties of this State, made agreeably to law, it appears that Richard C. Bowie of the first district, William C. Hamilton of the second district, Edward Hammond of the third district, Robert M. McLean of the fourth district, Alexander Evans of the fifth district and John E. Ryan of the sixth district had the highest number of votes in their respective districts and were duly elected members to represent this State in the next Congress of the United States.

Nov. 3rd 1849

The Governor this day upon the application of John Elghman of Queen Anne County granted a Writ of Habeas Corpus to his slave Harriet Turner charged with the crime of running away from him he being her master with a view to deprive him of her services, upon condition that she be sold beyond the limits of the State as a slave for life

Nov. 5th 1849

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Thomas G. Bowie Lt of 17th Regiment M. M. vice R. L. Elghman Commission vacated, having failed to report as required by resolution No. 84 of Dec. session 1847.

The Governor remitted the fine of five dollars imposed on William McFide by Baltimore City Court at the May term 1849 for an assault on Battery on Charles Baines.
