The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John S. McGuire Lt. Col. of 1st Regt. M. M. vice J. S. George Commission vacated, having failed to report as required by Resolution N. 84 of Dec. Session 1847. And also appointed and commissioned George W. Wilson Major of same Regiment vice J. S. George, promoted.

The Governor rejected the application of Nathan Kohn for a State Judge, who was indicted in Washington County, Court for selling liquor on the Sabbath

The Governor rejected the application of many of the most respectable citizens of Talbot County for a State Judge in the case of William S. Smyth charged with the crime of embezzling the funds of the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank of Maryland located at Eastern Cambridge in the year 1849

It appears by the annexed paper duly authenticated according to the laws of this state that negro Edward Chase slave of William S. Smyth stands charged with the crime of running away from his owner and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided I hereby request that the said Edward Chase be apprehended and delivered to Francis V. Boteler who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the state of Maryland there to be dealt with according to Law.
