

Nov. 13th 1844

The Governor rejected the application made by John Robert McLean in behalf of the society of Thomas Ayer for the remission of a part of the fine imposed by Kent County Court at the March assizes on the said Thomas Ayer for an assault and battery on James Sullivan.

Nov^r 14th 1849

The Governor this day, upon receipt of the requisition of the Governor of Pennsylvania for the arrest of a certain M. Chung alias Zebulon Phillips charged with the crime of Larceny committed in the city of Philadelphia, issued his warrant to the Warden of Baltimore city and County Jail directing him to deliver the said M. Chung alias Zebulon Phillips to John A. Logue the agent appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania to receive and convey him to that State.

Nov. 21st 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Thomas Milley and other respectable citizens of Baltimore granted habeas corpus to John Haney senior and John Haney junior indicted at the September term 1844 of Baltimore against of the crime of conspiring to defraud the said Thomas Milley of a very large sum of money.

Nov. 22nd 1849

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judge McKimism and several very respectable members of the Bar of Montgomery County Court remitted the forfeited recognizance of Henry Magner in two cases, one in the case of riot and the other that of assault and battery, for his appearance at the March Term 1847 of said Montgomery County Court; and also remitted the fine of five dollars imposed upon him at the November Term 1846 of said Court of the said assault and battery, but in each case only upon condition of payment of costs.

The Governor remitted the fine of two dollars imposed upon John C. Taylor by Anne Arundel County Court at October Term 1849 for an assault and battery upon one Grace Smith.

Nov. 24th 1849

Not: 24th Dec 1849
The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of the panel of jurors by whom he was tried and convicted, by nineteen of the Grand Jurors by whom he was indicted and by a great many of the most respectable citizens of Frederick County pardoned Charles Webb convicted in Frederick County Court at November Term 1849 of larceny and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary for two years and ten months.

The Governor appointed and Commissioned Robert Bowie Jr. vice. Thos. Hull Com^r vacated having failed to report as required by law; also re-appointed William² Bennett & George former Com^r vacated for same reason; also re-appointed and Commissioned John Manning former Com^r vacated for same reason and also appointed and Commissioned Daniel C. Digges vice G. M. Miller his Com^r vacated for same reason, each Captains in the 17th Regiment of Inf. M.
