

2nd March 1850

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Parraice, of the delegates to the General Assembly from Baltimore County and of many of the most respectable citizens of that county pardoned James Pew convicted in Baltimore County Court at November Term 1849 of the crime of Felony and sentenced to be confined in the penitentiary for the term of eighteen months

The Governor sent the following communication to the House of Delegates:

The Governor nominated to the Senate the lists of civil appointments for Frederick County and Saint Mary's County and that for the city of Baltimore except the justices of the peace

The Governor nominated to the Senate David West 2nd Lt and William S. Cross 3rd Lt of Baltimore Sharp Shotten; and William A. Straw to be Engage Major and Inspector of 3rd Engage vice Judge promoted; and Jesse Daskill to be Col. of 4th Regt. M. M. vice Turner declined.

The Governor upon the recommendation of three of the directors of the Penitentiary and of a great many of the most respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned H. H. Harrison alias William Lee convicted in Baltimore City Court at May Term 1849 of Felony and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary two years from the 28th day 1849

The Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him of their advice and consent to the appointments severally of certain persons to be auctors in Baltimore city, of certain persons to be justices of the peace Court of Baltimore city and county, of certain persons to be coroners of Baltimore city, of certain persons to be Justices Public of Baltimore city, of certain persons to be Commissioners of Insurgent debts of Baltimore city and county agreeably to the list of nominations made this day; and of certain persons to be inspectors of tobacco at the warehouses in Baltimore agreeably to the nominations of the 1st instant; and severally of civil officers for Baltimore County; and to the appointment of Galloway Thayer to be justice of the peace for Allegany County
