The Governor sent the following communication to the General Assembly:
State Department
Annapolis
March 7th 1850

To the General Assembly:

Henry H. S. Hay Esquire of Suit-Bay & County was appointed by me on the 21st of August last a Commissioner under resolution No. 11 of December Session 1849 to ascertain and define, in conjunction with Samuel P. Egre a Commissioner appointed on the part of Pennsylvania and George Lead Riddle Esquire a Commissioner appointed on the part of Delaware, certain boundaries between the State of Maryland, Pennsylvania and Delaware join each other. The Commissioners have performed this duty in a very able and satisfactory manner; and the accompanying report and papers, and the map of the boundaries adjusted and fixed by them prepared by Lt. Col. James S. Brantice of the U. S. Inf. Corps formerly detailed by the War Department for this particular service at the request of these States respectively which have just been received at this Department are herewith transmitted for such disposition as to the Legislature may seem proper

The Governor nominated to the Senate the Lumber Inspectors for Baltimore City, the Peace Inspectors for Prince George's County, and several justices of the peace in several of the Counties

A joint Committee composed of Messrs. Phelps and Whaley of the Senate and Messrs. Gausin and Bell of the House having waited upon his Excellency the Governor and informed him that the two houses of the Legislature would convene in the Senate Chamber this evening at 4 o'clock to witness the ceremony of signing and sealing the laws the Governor proceeded to the Senate Chamber at that hour to perform that duty.

8th March 1850
The Governor nominated the list of magistrates for the City of Baltimore and additional appointments for Allegany County

The Governor nominated certain persons for military appointments in 34th Regiment M. M.

9th March 1850
The Governor nominated to the Senate John R. Blake for Director of the Penitentiary vice James Frazer Com. expired; and also Richard Lilly for same vice James B. Wagner Com. expired.

The Governor having been requested by the Senate returned the civil list of Cecil County for correction.
