

9th March 1850  
The Governor nominated James Gilmore manager of the House of Refuge vice Blake appointed a director in the Penitentiary

The Governor nominated to the Senate Marcus R. Hook for Inspector and keeper of Coal in the city of Baltimore.

The Governor received a communication from the Senate informing him of their advice and consent to all the appointments, specially made and not before acted upon.

14th March 1850  
The Governor having this day received a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania for the arrest of John Austin charged with the crime of Larceny committed in the County of Adams of that State, issued his warrant to the jailor of Frederick County in whose custody he is, to deliver him to Nicholas Weaver the Agent of Pennsylvania for the purpose.

The Governor this day directed the following circular to the Editors of the several newspapers in the State.

State Department

Annapolis March 14th 1850

Sir: You will please insert in your paper once in each successive week before the first Wednesday of May next an act to provide for the taking the sense of the people upon the expediency of calling a Convention to form a new constitution and form of Government for this State and to provide for the election of delegates to such Convention passed at December Session 1849 a copy of which you will receive herewith.

15th March 1850  
The Governor pardoned John Johnson a free colored man convicted in Frederick County Court at March term 1850 of stealing an axe and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for 18 months.

The Governor pardoned Richard Yester convicted in Dorchester County Court at April term 1848 of kidnaping and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until 1st May 1850.

The Governor received the resignation of Greenbury Purnell Justice of the Peace of the 1st District of Cecil County and appointed and commissioned Andrew Orr in his place.
