

23<sup>rd</sup> April 1850

The Governor this day appointed, and commissioned Goddard Cooke to be Lt. Col. of the 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment M. M. former Commission vacated, having failed to report as required by law.

The Governor appointed and commissioned, severally, Caleb W. Logan to reside at Louisville Kentucky, John Claiborne and Paul Pequet to reside at New Orleans Louisiana and Lucius Kernan to reside at San Francisco California Commissions of record &c.

The Governor upon the recommendation of a great many of the most respectable citizens of the city of Baltimore pardoned George Hoff convicted at the January term 1849 of Baltimore city court of the crime of forgery and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until 2<sup>nd</sup> April 1852.

25<sup>th</sup> April 1850

The Governor this day issued the following requisition  
State of Maryland to the Philip Thomas Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland  
In His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania:

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that William L. Patterson, Joseph Murphy and Robert C. Cunningham stand charged with the crime of an assault with intent to kill one Samuel M. Waller committed in the County of Harford in the State of Maryland aforesaid and it has been represented to me that they have fled from the jurisdiction of this State and have taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said William L. Patterson, Joseph Murphy and Robert C. Cunningham be apprehended and delivered to Robert McGowan who I hereby duly authorize to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this twenty fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.
