

2<sup>nd</sup> July 1850

The Governor this day received and approved the bond of Edmund Claude Esquire of Maryland and then delivered it to the Clerk of Anne Arundel County Court to be recorded according to law.

3<sup>rd</sup> July 1850

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens of Baltimore remitted the fine of ten dollars imposed upon Charles Ogle by Baltimore City Court at May term 1850 for an assault and battery upon one Henry Deal.

5<sup>th</sup> July 1850

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of the jury by whom he was tried and convicted and many respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned Isaac Swann convicted in Baltimore City Court at January Term 1847 of felony and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary until 1<sup>st</sup> April 1852.

9<sup>th</sup> July 1850

The Governor having this day received a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania for the arrest of William Blakey charged with the crimes of larceny and obtaining money under false pretences committed in the County of Philadelphia issued a warrant to the jailer of Baltimore City Jail which is required to deliver him to the Agent of the State of Pennsylvania appointed to receive him.

The Governor upon the recommendation of the jury by whom he was tried and convicted and by many respectable citizens of Baltimore pardoned George King convicted at May term 1850 of Baltimore City Court of the crime of felony.
