

Davis stands charged with the crime of obtaining money under false pretences committed in the city of Baltimore in said State of Maryland and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of New York.

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said Thomas Davis be apprehended and delivered to S. C. Moore who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judge Crane and many respectable citizens of Charles County remitted twenty dollars of the fine of twenty five dollars imposed by Charles County Court at February term 1850 on William W. Remond for assault and battery upon one John C. Davis; and also remitted forty dollars of the fine of fifty dollars imposed by the same Court upon him at the same term for assault and battery upon the same person.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Judge Aschmitt and others pardoned Thomas Ryan alias Riley convicted at January term 1847 of Baltimore County of the crime of felony and sentenced to be confined until 13th August 1857.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that a certain person L. Chaplin stands charged with the crime of an assault with intent to kill one William Smyth committed in the County of Montgomery in the said State of Maryland and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said William L. Chaplin be apprehended and delivered to Edward F. Brady who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
