

9th September 1850

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Jeremiah Mulliken
Inspector of Prisons at the Upper Marlboro' workhouse in Prince George's County
vice Jeremiah Mulliken Senior deceased.

The Governor this day remitted the fine of twenty dollars imposed by Baltimore
City Court upon Bernard Kelly for an assault and battery at the September term 1849

11th September 1850

The Governor appointed and commissioned William S. Hittings Colonel,
David Brown Lieutenant Colonel, and Lambert S. Steward Major of 2nd Regiment
Artillery 1st Brigade 3rd division M. M.

The Governor upon the recommendation of Thomas S. Bowie and others pardoned
Thomas Washington colored, convicted on the 25th April 1842 in Prince George's
County Court of Murder in the 2nd degree and sentenced to labor and serve
in the Penitentiary until 25th April 1860.

12th September 1850

The Governor this day granted a Writ of Habeas Corpus to Jane Black slave of
Woodman Leban of Queen Anne County charged with running away from her
master upon condition that she be sold beyond the limits of the State as a slave for life.

16th September 1850

The Governor this day remitted the fine of ten dollars imposed upon
John Bowman by Baltimore City Court at May term 1850 for rioting.

17th September 1850

The Governor this day issued the following requisition:

State of Maryland for.

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland

His Excellency the Governor of Virginia

It appears by the aforesaid papers duly authenticated according to the laws of the State
of Maryland that Thomas McLaughlin stands charged with the crime of murder committed in the County
of Alleghany in said State of Maryland and it has been represented to me that he has fled from
the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the aforesaid State of
Maryland and provided I do hereby request that the said Thomas McLaughlin be apprehended and
delivered to David McLeary who is hereby duly authorized to receive and carry him to
the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and
the Great Seal of the State this seventeenth day of September in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty
