

28th Oct. 1850

The Governor this day granted a Warrant for the arrest of Richard J. Cobb indicted at the October term 1849 of the Circuit Court for an assault and battery upon one William L. Buck.

29th Oct. 1850

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned J. Rusby, Major Adjutant, 4th Regiment M. M. vice Mackey promoted and also appointed and commissioned L. Ellison the book Captain Moore Dillon 1st Lt. and R. S. Smith the Cornet 2nd Lt. of Scott's Infantry, 10th Regiment M. M.

30th Oct. 1850

The Governor this day upon the receipt of the requisition of the Governor of Virginia for the arrest of Anthony Reason and M. Kirby fugitives from the justice of that State issued his warrant to the Justice of Baltimore City and County to deliver them to Samuel A. Clapham the agent for that purpose.

1st November 1850

The Governor this day increased the number of the Committee on the Industrial Exhibition to be held in London in May 1851 by adding thereto the name of Col. George W. Hughes

5th November 1850

The Governor this day made the following communication to the Convention now in session at the seat of government in answer to a request of that body presented by a Committee thereof of Messrs. Lusk, Adams and Swain

Gentlemen of the Convention:

I have the honor, in compliance with your request, to transmit herewith the return of the election held on the first Wednesday of September last, under the act of December Session eighteen hundred and forty nine Chapter three hundred and forty six entitled "an act to provide for the taking the sense of the people upon the expediency of calling a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of Government for this State and to provide for the election of delegates to such Convention," and a list of the delegates to the Convention
