

25th November 1850

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned George F. Mason a notary public to reside at Leonard town in Saint Marys County

The Governor issued the following requestions
State of Maryland to wit

Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland
To His Excellency the Governor of Virginia.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this state that a certain Folger P. Lovegrove stands charged with the crime of forgery committed in the city of Baltimore in the said state of Maryland and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state and has taken refuge within the state of Virginia

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said Folger P. Lovegrove be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Jefford and John Graham who are hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the state of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this twenty fifth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.
