

1<sup>st</sup> January, 1851

The Governor this day upon the recommendation of Judge Asbitt remitted the fine of fifty dollars imposed upon Samuel H. Gover by Baltimore city Court at September term 1850 for selling goods without a license

3<sup>rd</sup> January, 1851

The Governor this appointed and commissioned John S. Gelling Col. of the 5<sup>th</sup> Regiment M. U. vice A. Ackman promoted.

The Governor upon the recommendation of many respectable citizens pardoned George Maddox convicted of felony in Saint Mary's County Court and Joseph Beaman convicted in Baltimore city Court of felony and confined in the penitentiary

The Governor appointed and commissioned John S. Gelling Lt. Col. and Sarah Wagner, Major of 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment Artillery 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade 3 divisions M. U., and also E. Taylor Lt. Col. and Robert C. Barry Major of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade 3 divisions M. U. and also appointed and commissioned the following persons Captains in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment: William H. Hayward Captain of Company A, John W. Miller Captain of Company B, William H. Denny Captain of Company C, William H. Briggs Captain of Company D, and John P. Dukhart Captain of Company E.

The Governor issued the following requisition  
State of Maryland to wit: Philip Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland  
To His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that a certain Elijah Brown alias Williams stands charged with the crime of Stealing committed in the city of Baltimore and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the jurisdiction of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania

And therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the <sup>United</sup> States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said Elijah Brown alias Williams be apprehended and delivered to Emanuel Stockett who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
