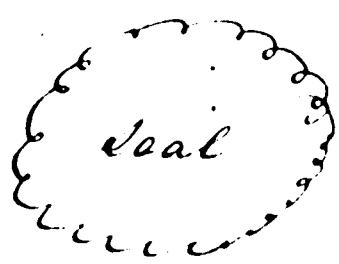


authorized to receive and convey to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

February 6th 1851

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of Doct. Thomas C. Ristean, Samuel H. Jaggard & Robert G. Armstrong, Esqrs. and Rev.^d Alfred Griffith, pardoned John Plaskitt, convicted in the Ninth election district Court in Baltimore County, on the 1st day of February 1851 of an assault and battery on Joseph Parks of said County and sentenced to pay a fine of fifty dollars and twelve dollars & fifty eight cents costs, with fifteen days imprisonment in the Baltimore County Jail, upon payment by him of the fine and costs aforesaid, as a condition precedent.

February 10th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Thomas F. Bowie, Brigadier General 4th Brigade 1st Division, vice Wm S. Bowie resigned; also appointed and commissioned David E. Thomas, Jr. Captain of Company F, 27th Regiment, M. M.; A. Francis Dunlavy, Captain of Company G, 27th Regiment, M. M.; Gam^c. C. Parke, 1st Lieutenant of Company D, 27th Regiment M. M. and Louis Serway, Paymaster 27th Regiment M. M.

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned John Snyder a Justice of the peace for Washington County, vice Jacob Powers declined.

February 11th 1851

This day the Governor appointed and commissioned Absalom Eakle Justice of the peace for Washington County, vice Daniel W. Furry declined; John A. B. Leonard, Justice of the peace for Montgomery County, vice Reuben M. Mosley resigned; and Charles A. Seloup, Justice of the peace for the third district composed of the 9th-10th-11th & 13th wards of the City of Baltimore, vice Walton Gray resigned.

February 12th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Robert O. Brent, of Baltimore City, Attorney General of Maryland, vice George R. Richardson, deceased; also James Williard, Captain, Francis A. Hoffman 1st Lieutenant, and Henry C. Swall 2nd Lieutenant of Caloetin Dragoons 1st Regiment, 1st Regimental Cavalry District M. M., vice Rider, Williard and Hoffman
