E. Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania:

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that a man by the name of Vanhorn, alias John Tull committed larceny in the City of Baltimore, by stealing a trunk and contents, from Gays Hotel, the property of Oliver Miller, Esquire, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state and has taken refuge within the state of Pennsylvania.
