

July 31<sup>st</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received the report of James C Nyland, Inspector of Foreign and Domestic Signers in the City of Baltimore, from 1<sup>st</sup> of January to the 30<sup>th</sup> of June 1851

August 1<sup>st</sup> 1851

This day the Governor ordered notice to be given in the Baltimore "Sun" and "Argus" of the application of Frederick Heif, a convict in the Maryland Penitentiary, for pardon.

August 6<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received a report from the clerk of the Board of Commissioners of Cecil County, of the Annual levy of State and County taxes for the year 1851 and of the appointment of efficient Collectors in all the districts

August 7<sup>th</sup> 1851

This day the Governor received from George H. Dutton, Chief Inspector of Fish, a report of Salted Fish inspected in the City of Baltimore for the quarter ending June 30<sup>th</sup> 1851.

August 11<sup>th</sup> 1851

The Governor this day received from the Clerk of Frederick County Court a copy of the Official Bond of John W Meyer, Collector of State direct tax for Frederick County.

August 12<sup>th</sup> 1851

State of Maryland - to wit:

E. Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To his Excellency, the Governor of New Jersey:

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Elijah Bowen, alias, Charles Williams alias, Jacob M. Blair, stands charged of feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away from John M. McIntock, in the City of Baltimore, one Buggy Wagon, one Bay Mare and one set of Harness, the property of said McIntock and of the value of three hundred and fifty dollars, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of New Jersey.

Now Therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Elijah Bowen, alias Charles Williams, alias Jacob M. Blair be apprehended and delivered to A. G. Ridgely, a citizen of the City of Baltimore in this State, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
