The Governor this day issued the following requisition on the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia:

State of Maryland, to wit:

E. Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,  
To the Honorable the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States  
for the District of Columbia.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Patrick Roley, upon the oath of a certain John Riley, duly made before a justice of the peace of the City of Baltimore in this State, stands charged of feloniously stealing and carrying away "a hat and a pair of shoes the property of him, the said John Riley, and of the value of six dollars, and it has been represented to me that the said Patrick Roley has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Patrick Roley be apprehended and delivered to Joseph J. Pearson to is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

The Governor this day issued the following requisition.

State of Maryland, to wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To His Excellency the Governor of Virginia.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Patrick Kafer, upon the oath of Thomas Crawford, Murty Ganightly and Hugh Mulloy, citizens of Allegany County in this State, duly made before Andrew Gonder a Justice of the Peace in and for said County, stands charged of having "feloniously stole and carried away, Bank Notes and Gold coin to the amount of seventy dollars the property of the said above named parties, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Patrick Kafer be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Paxton who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
