

November 17th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and Commissioned William Bailey, Inspector and Corder of Fire Wood in Baltimore City, vice John Brauchamp resigned.

November 18th 1851

The Governor this day appointed and Commissioned Stephen Beard one of the Judges of the Orphans Court for Anne Arundel County vice S^r Stevens Gambrell, deceased.

The Governor, upon the recommendation of Judge Nisbet, John Scharff, Th. Dolan and James H. Merrill and other highly respectable citizens of Baltimore City, pardoned Frederick Hiff, who was convicted of felony in Baltimore City Court at January term 1850 and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary until the 4th of April 1855, upon condition that he shall leave the State of Maryland and never return thereto.

The Governor, upon the recommendation of J. W. Crisfield, Wm. S. Waters, S. W. Jones, L. Woolford, Wm. J. G. Folk, Wm. M. Handy, John Flemming, Nathan J. Langford, John H. Bone, George Handy, Levin K. Handy, Jas. W. Monson, Edward Long, Benjamin Langford and John H. Mills; granted a Nolle Prosequi to Joshua W. Hull, who stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of Somerset County with having falsly and knowingly forged and counterfeited a certain writing on paper. See Pardon Record.

The Governor, upon the recommendation of James M. Schley, Deputy Attorney General, Thomas Perry and Daniel Blocker Esqrs. and about one thousand other highly respectable citizens of Allegany County, pardoned Jesse D. E. Quantill, who was convicted at the April term, 1849, of Allegany County Court of assault and battery on a certain Mary Bowten and sentenced to imprisonment in the County jail for five years and to pay a fine of five hundred dollars, upon the condition that he immediately leaves the State of Maryland and never again returns within its borders; and also released him from the said fine.

November 19th 1851

The following Certificate of the election, of Members of Congress to represent the State of Maryland in the Congress of the United States, was transmitted to each of the gentlemen elected, to the Secretary of State of the United States and to the Clerk of the House of Representatives.

State of Maryland, to wit:

Whereas an election was held on Wednesday the first day of October last, in the several Congressional Districts of this State, as described by law, for Members to represent this State in the next Congress of the United States, and Whereas it is made the duty of the Governor, after having ascertained the number of Votes given for each person voted for and declared by proclamation the names of those elected, to transmit a Certificate of said Election to the Secretary of State of the United States, or other proper officer authorized to receive the same, to be by him delivered to the House of Representatives in the Congress of the United States when assembled; and Whereas the number of said votes has been ascertained and proclamation made accordingly.
