

January 2<sup>d</sup> 1852

The Governor this day issued the following requisition.  
State of Maryland to wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,  
To the Honorable the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United  
States, for the District of Columbia.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain George A Williams is charged with having feloniously stolen, taken and carried away from the State of Maryland a sorrel gelding, the property of a certain William N Dean, a citizen of the said State, and it has been represented to me that the said George Williams fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

Now therefore pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said George A Williams be apprehended and delivered to William Stewart who is hereby authorized to receive and convey to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.



In witness whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two.
