State of Maryland - To wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,
To His Excellency, the Governor of New York.

It appears by the announced papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain David E Johns stands charged, upon the oath of John Graham of the City of Baltimore, of stealing from the habitation, in said City, one gold Hunting Watch, chain and seal, a five dollar note and pen knife, the property of a certain George P. Thomas, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the jurisdiction of this State and has taken refuge within the State of New York.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said David E Johns be apprehended and delivered to John Graham who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

Notice to terminate on Saturday the third of April next.
