The Governor this day submitted the following communication to the Senate:

To the Senate:

Gentlemen:- I heretofore nominated for Tobacco Inspectors in the City of Baltimore, Perry G. Etchison, for Warehouse No. 2, and George W. Hammond, for Warehouse No. 4. The former nominee is a resident of Montgomery County, and the latter of Anne Arundel County. It seems to have been found convenient, from past experience, that the Officer from Montgomery (when one was appointed from that County) should occupy Warehouse No. 2. I, therefore, respectfully ask leave to withdraw the said two nominations as made; and, I now nominate George W. Hammond, for Inspector of Tobacco in the City of Baltimore, for Warehouse No. 2, and Perry G. Etchison, the same, for Warehouse No. 4.
