

January 5th. 1853.

The Governor received the reports of Alexander Cummings and William J. Lankford, Inspector and Gaugers of Liquors, for the half year, ended 31st. ulto.

7th.

The Governor received an order of the House of Delegates requesting that the flag should be displayed on the 8th of January, in honor of the Anniversary of the Battle of New Orleans.

The Governor accordingly directed the Adjutant General to have the flag displayed.

7th.

The Governor issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Frederick County authorizing him to deliver to John Aldop, a certain John Fyan, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Pennsylvania.

14th.

The Governor received the resignation of Richard Fyding, a Justice of the Peace in and for Anne Arundel County.

17th.

The Governor received the report of George Elliott, Inspector and Gauger of Liquors, for the six months from May to November, 1852.

17th.

The Governor received the resignation of Anthony Tall, a Justice of the Peace in and for Calvert County.

19th.

The Governor received the semi-annual report of Thomas J. Welch, Inspector and Gauger of Liquors.

20th.

The Governor transmitted the following message:
