The Governor remitted a fine of twenty dollars imposed on Patrick Daily for selling liquor on the Sabbath, upon the recommendation of Judge Perry who imposed the fine, and of J. Philip Roman, Q. Mocher, J. H. Schley, G. B. M. Price, G. B. McCullough, D. McKeary, William Keill H. Kesley and others.

28th.

The Governor transmitted to the General Assembly the following Message:

To The General Assembly,

Gentlemen:

In accordance with the requirements of Section 20, Article III of the Constitution, I have the honor herewith to transmit my account of the Contingent Fund appropriated at your last session for the year 1852, showing the amount expended and the purposes to which it was applied.

The Governor transmitted to the General Assembly copies of a communication received from the Honorable J. S. Stevens, Governor of the Territory of Washington asking for certain public documents for the use of the Library of said Territory.

25th.

The Governor refused to grant the pardon of William Heard, convicted of larceny at November Term, 1852, of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County.

25th.

The Governor directed notice of an application for the pardon of William Jones, alias Carter convicted of Burglary at January Term 1851, of the Baltimore City Court, to be published; to expire on the 15th of April proximo.

28th.

The Governor remitted the fine of one hundred dollars imposed upon Louis R. Fechtig by the Circuit Court for Washington County, at March Term 1853, for keeping a gaming house, upon the recommendation of Judge Perry, Hon. Wm. T. Hamilton Thomas Harbin, State's Attorney, C. Hilliard, Isaac Keibitt, G. W. Smith, Alex. Keill, Jr., George Schley, R. B. Alvey and others.

The Governor issued his warrant to the Sheriff of Washington County to arrest and deliver a certain John Smith charged with larceny, to Thomas J. Early Esq. agent of Pennsylvania under a requisition.
