The Governor this day sent to the senate his list of nominations for officers general and local throughout the state including a list of commissioners of the State to take acknowledgements of deeds in other states. In particular see Book of Executive Nominations.

In forenoon this day assigned Frederick Stone and Robert Ford Esqs Attorneys to assist Geo S. King Esq District Attorney for St. Mary's County in the prosecution of Nelson Bayard and Joseph Lawrence, for a person under indictment for murder in the Circuit Court for Charles County.

21st

The Governor to day, upon the recommendation of the Hon. Judge Peter H. Branch ^{and others} remitted 3 fines of \$20 ^{each} imposed upon Mrs Sarah Mitchell at the April Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Prince George County, for a violation of the law prohibiting the sale of liquor on the sabbath.

The Gov. to day directed notice to be given in the matter of the Application for the pardon of James Donley and James Dubanoy convicted of Larceny at the May Term of the Circuit Court for Annapolis County 1853.

The Governor refused to remit the forfeiture of recognizance in the case of John J. Herbst of St. Mary's County charged with Larceny and having failed to appear.

The Gov. refused to pardon John Newsham of Allegany Co. confined in the Maryland Penitentiary for larceny.
