

May 1<sup>st</sup> 1854.

The Governor this day granted a Pardon to John W. Tydings convicted of Larceny at the April Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County and sentenced to undergo confinement in the Penitentiary for the Term of Two years.

The Gov. this day, upon the Requisition of the Governor of Virginia, issued to the Sheriff of Baltimore City, or any County where the party may be found <sup>his Majesty</sup> for the arrest of, and delivery to Chas. D. May, the Agent of the State of Virginia in that behalf, of a certain Stephen Burr Felt alias Robert J. Drew charged in the County of this Virginia with Larceny.

May 17<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Governor this day pardoned John H. Maloney who was convicted at March Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Caroline County of Larceny and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary of the State for two years from 18<sup>th</sup> March 1854.

The Governor this day pardoned Francis Mott, convicted at January Term 1851 of the late Baltimore City Court of Manslaughter and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary for nine years and five months.

In the matter of the State vs Luther alias Luke Burns convicted at January Term 1854 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, of the Crime of Murder in the first degree, the Governor this day commuted punishment from Death to confinement in the Penitentiary for life.
