

July 3<sup>d</sup> 1854.

The Gov. issued his order to Gen. A. Matthews Adjutant General M. M. directing him to have on the 4<sup>th</sup> inst the National flag displayed from the Stuple of the State House and the usual salutes fired in honor of the day.

July 8<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Gov. pardoned John Murray who was convicted June Term 1844 of late Baltimore City Court of Burglary & Felony & Felony and sentenced to confinement in Penitentiary for the terms of seven and five years respectively

The Gov. granted a pardon to John Groves, who was convicted January Term 1854 of Criminal Court of Baltimore of an assault on Sarah Ann, and sentenced to six months imprisonment in the Jail of Baltimore City and County and to pay a fine of \$20.

July 15<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Governor issued this day a Requisition upon the Governor of Virginia for the apprehension of John A. Rhodes, charged on the oath of one Thomas S. Johnson with the larceny of a horse the property of Stephen Trayer of St. Marys County in this State and appointing Thomas S. Johnson the Agent of this State to receive the said fugitive.

July 21<sup>st</sup> 1854

The Gov. this day directed publication of the usual notice in the matter of the application for the Pardon of John Dipple Comdant of Mercury Jan. Term 1854 Criminal Court Baltimore and to serve of labor in Penitentiary until July 1855. Also sent to Gen. A. "Argus". Expires 14<sup>th</sup> August.
