

July 26th 1854.

The Governor this day pardoned John Holton convicted May Term 1854 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of Manslaughter and sentenced to work and labor in the Penitentiary of the State for the term of two years.

August 5th 1854.

The Governor this day remitted forfeitures of recognizance in two cases of Joseph Flint, surety for the appearance of John Sampson, Negro, at April Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Dorchester County to answer to a charge of Larceny &c.

August 7th 1854

The Governor this day remitted the fine of two hundred dollars imposed upon George Beahm, at March Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Washington County, for keeping a Gambling House.

The Governor remitted this day three fines of one hundred dollars each, imposed upon Nathan T. Dutton, at the July Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Charles County, for receiving as a Justice of the Peace illegal fees.

The Governor refused to pardon William Perry convicted of Larceny at May Term 1854 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore

The Gov. refused a pardon in the case of Philip Johns, convicted at September Term 1844 of the late Baltimore City Court of firing the Lumber Yard of boats and Gleason.
