The Governor this day directed advertisement, in Balt. Sun. and Republican and signs, of the writ of Habeas Corpus in the matter of the Application for Pardon of James Hughes who was on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1850, in the late Baltimore City Court convicted of Larceny and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 30<sup>th</sup> April 1851.

The Governor directed publication of Notice of application having been made to him for the pardon of Charles Johnson, Negro Slave, who was convicted, on two several indictments in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, October Term 1854, of an Assault upon William McHardisty, and of an Assault with intent to kill upon John C. Gardner. Notice sent to Maryland Republican published at Annapolis. Notice will expire 26<sup>th</sup> inst.
