

Dec. 13<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Governor this day pardoned James Hughes, who was convicted at January Term 1850 of the late Baltimore City Court on four several Indictments for Felony and thereupon sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 30<sup>th</sup> of August 1858.

Dec. 20<sup>th</sup> 1854

The Governor this day assigned James S. Franklin Esq. Counsel on the part of the State in case at the suit of John Cochran now pending in the Court of Appeals of this State in Part of Error.

Dec. 21<sup>st</sup> 1854.

The Governor issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore City authorizing him to arrest and deliver one Frederick C. Cook to Lucius P. Bryan, the agent of the State of Connecticut in that behalf. The said Cook being charged with the crime of seduction, committed in that State and having fled from the Justice thereof and taken refuge in the State of Maryland and a requisition for his arrest and delivery, from the Governor of Connecticut having upon the Governor of this State having been received at this Department.

Dec. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1854.

The Governor this day issued a Requisition on the Governor of the State of New York for the arrest, and delivery to Peter P. Potter, of Joseph Ashley alias Joseph Davis, who stands charged upon the oath of a certain Robert Fountain of Baltimore County in this State with the crime of Larceny.
