

Jan'y. 6. 1855.

The Governor this day issued an Order to the Adjt. General A. M. directing him to have the National Flag displayed from the top of State House Staircase on Monday 8th January next in commemoration of the victory achieved by the American troops under Genl. Andrew Jackson over the British forces on the 8th January 1815. at New Orleans.

Jan'y. 10.

The Governor directed the usual publication of Notice in the matter of the application for a Writ of Habeas Corpus in the case of Negroes Bob and Dick, Slaves of Dr Arthur Pine and Mrs. Fox, charged with Burglary and now confined in Howard County Jail. Case to be taken up on or after Feb. 3rd 1855.

The Governor also directed Notice to be given of the Application for a Pardon in the case of Andrew and Jerry, slaves for years, convicted ~~in~~ the September Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Howard County of Burglary. Case to be taken up on or after 3rd Feb'y 1855.

Jan'y. 11.

The Governor directed publication of Notice of application having been made for the pardon of Rufus S. Payne, convicted Oct. Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County of an assault and battery on Thomas Sengstack. Case to be taken up on or after Jan'y 22. 1855.
