

March 23.

The Governor assigned A. B. Lockett and L. M. Wallace Esquires as counsel on the part of the state to aid in the prosecution of one John Morgan who was indicted at the October Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County for entering slaves to run away and in the instance of the said Morgan removed to Carroll County for trial.

The Governor assigned a. L. Martin Esq. to aid in the prosecution of such persons as may be prosecuted for breaking open the Prison in Caroline County taking out one of the persons confined there and hanging him.

The Governor remitted two several fines of \$25 each imposed upon Edward Gittinger and Charles Keifer at the October Term 1854 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County for conspiracy &c.

March 31st.

The Governor this day assigned Joseph M. Palmer as counsel on the part of the state to aid in the prosecution of Isaac Sike Parrish and others who stand charged with a Robbery committed ~~committed~~ in Carroll County upon the premises of Peter Bluff.

April 2^d.

The Governor pardoned Henry Pinchot convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore, September Term 1853, of Larceny and sentenced to service and labor in the Maryland Penitentiary until 3. October 1855.

Pardon granted by the Governor to John H. Williams prisoner under the name of John H. Taylor in the Criminal Court of Baltimore January Term 1854 of Larceny and sentenced to service and labor in the Penitentiary of the State until 6. June 1857.
