

June 1st 1855.

The Governor this day assigned Les. S. Franklin Counsel on the part of the State in the matter of the state vs Emanuel Raab, now pending in the Court of Appeals on Writ of Error from the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County.

June 4th

The Governor this day, upon the Requisition of the Governor of the State of Virginia, issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore City authorizing him to deliver to Mr. Bowling, the Agent of the State of Virginia in that behalf, a certain Henry Gipping, a fugitive from justice now confined in the Jail of the said City and charged upon the affidavit of Thomas Murray with having feloniously stolen and carried away from the store of said Murray in the town of Fredericksburg in the State of Virginia sundry gold and silver watches and other articles of Jewelry.

11th

The Governor this day, in compliance with a request of the Legislature of Maryland expressed in the last of a series of Resolutions passed at the January Session 1854, and numbered Nine, transmitted through the Office of the Assistant Secy of the United States, Washington, duly authenticated copies of said Resolutions to Lieutenants Charles S. Winder and William D. Winder of the Army of the United States.

14th

The Gov. this day pardoned, and remitted the fine of Ten dollars, in the case of Columbus Buckmaster convicted at May Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Calvert County of an assault of Betty and ordered to be imprisoned in County Jail sixty days & pay fine of Ten dollars.
