

July 17<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day remitted three fines of \$50 each which were imposed upon Matthias Downer by the Circuit Court for Somerset County at its January Term 1855 for three several assaults upon three of his children.

The Governor this day granted a pardon to Andrew Hammond who was convicted in Indictment in the Circuit Court for Washington County at its March Term 1855 of Larceny and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary for the period of eighteen months.

The Gov. directed publication of Notice of application having been made to him for the pardon of Joseph D. Strayer who was convicted at the April Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County of an Assault and Battery and sentenced to be confined in Baltimore City Jail for six months and pay a fine of five dollars.

Notice sent to Baltimore Sun, and Balt. Republican. Case to be taken up on or after the 31<sup>st</sup> inst.

July 24<sup>th</sup>

The Governor directed publication of the usual Notice of application having been made to him for the Pardon of Owen O'Neal, convicted at May Term 1854 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of an Assault with intent to kill Alexander Mc'Nebe and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June 1861. Case to be considered on or after 14<sup>th</sup> Aug<sup>t</sup> prox.

The Gov. remitted a fine of \$20. imposed upon Samuel Pharmed by Justice Ignatius Peter of Howard County for selling without License.
