

July 26th 1855

The Governor this day issued his Requisition upon the Governor of Massachusetts for a certain George Connor, alias Jerry Best, alias Charles Bellas, charged upon the Affidavit of John N. Brown with having obtained in the Month of June 1855 in the City of Baltimore the sum of seventeen hundred and seventeen dollars and seventy cents under false pretences from William Brown and others trading as Brown Brothers & Co.

July 31st 55

The Gov. issued his Requisition upon the Governor of Massachusetts for the arrest of William L. Bloomer who is charged upon the Affidavit of George H. Howard with the crime of obtaining of George H. Howard & Co. of the City of Baltimore goods to the value of about \$850. under false and fraudulent pretences. Andrew Donaldson Agent of this State appointed by the Gov. to receive the said fugitive and bring him into this State.

The Gov. also pardoned Joseph Kruger, convicted at April Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County of Assault and Battery, upon Indictment found by the Grand Jury of Baltimore City, and sentenced to 20 months imprisonment in Baltimore City Jail.

The Governor also remitted a fine of \$50 imposed upon John Price by the Circuit Court for Somerset Co. at its April Term 1855 for violating the 12th and 13th Sections of an Act of this State of 1852 ch. 337 and entitled An Act to provide for the General valuation and assessment of property in this State.

The Gov. also directed publication of the usual Notice of Application, having been made for the pardon of Joseph B. Lee, convicted of Assault & Battery with intent to kill, at Sep. Term 1852 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore. To be considered August 14th
