

August 24/1855.

The Governor this day Pardoned Elizabeth Blow-Linnott, alias Elizabeth Smith who was convicted at May Term 1855 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of the Larceny of 15 yards of muslin.

The Governor also issued his Requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the arrest of one George H. Lane who is charged upon the affidavit of Jason Stockbridge of Baltimore City with having feloniously stolen taken and carried away on or about the 16th July 1855 from the National Hotel in the City of Baltimore two sets of Silver Castors one dozen ivory handled dessert knives and one dozen silver spoons the property of said Stockbridge and of the value of about \$50. John Graham appointed the agent of this State in the premises.

Aug^t 6th

The Governor this day directed publication of the usual Notice of Application having been made for the Pardon of Joshua Martin, John Niles, convicted May Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County of Larceny and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary of this State for two years. Notice to expire 25th inst. and sent to Centerville Times.

Aug^t 14th

The Gov. Pardoned Joseph B. Leo convicted at the September Term 1852 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of assaulting and beating John Frederick with intent to murder, and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary until the 8th day of October 1852. The Pardon in this case was granted because of the insane condition of the Prisoner and the Warden instructed not to release him until some appearance authorized to take charge of him.
