

September 10<sup>th</sup> 1855.

The Governor named Francis Shaw John Johnson and Lewis C. Brown Esquires as the persons to view and examine the Turnpike Road referred to in the Act of 1853 chapter 314. and to report to him in writing whether the said road is executed in a masterly and workmanlike manner.

Notice of the foregoing appointments having been made sent to the President of the said road company.

11<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day pardoned Owen O'Neil who was convicted at the May Term 1854 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of Assaulting with intent to kill Alexander Mc Cabe and sentenced to serve and labor in the Penitentiary until the fourteenth day of June, eighteen hundred and sixty one.

12<sup>th</sup>

The Governor issued his Warrant directed to the Sheriff of Baltimore City or of any County in this State authorizing the arrest of John Lowman, charged by indictment with the seduction committed within the State of New York, and his delivery to Philander A. Randall the Agent of the State of New York in that behalf.

14<sup>th</sup>

The Governor remitted the amercement of John Hayes, Sheriff of Baltimore City, in the sum of one hundred dollars in the matter of State vs. Rash at November Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County.
